How to Make a Pine Cone Bird Feeder

FeederSupplies:

- Pine Cones
- Peanut Butter
- Bird Seeds
- Plastic Spoon, Popsicle stick, or Spatula (to spread the peanut butter)
- Paper Plate



Directions:

1. Place the pine cone on a paper plate.
2. Using a plastic spoon or spatula, spread peanut butter around the pine cone. Try to cover as much of the pine cone as you can with a thin layer of peanut butter.
3. Once the pine cone is covered in peanut butter, roll the pine cone around in the bird seeds until the pine cone is covered with birdseed.
4. Tie a string at the top of the pine cone and hang it from a tree in your yard.

Toilet Paper Roll Bird Feeder.

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

Cardboard tubes- toilet paper rolls

Peanut butter

Knives (plastic) or popsicle sticks

Paper plate

birdseed

twine



1. Use a popsicle stick or butter knife to spread peanut butter on a clean toilet paper roll.

TIP: If you use vegetable shortening, like Crisco, it will make your toilet paper roll water-resistant, which makes this bird feeder perfect for rainy spring days!

2. Roll the toilet paper roll on a plate filled with birdseed.

3. String a loop of twine through the toilet paper roll.

4. Hang the toilet paper roll bird feeder on a bush or slide it onto a branch.

HOW TO MAKE A BIRD SEED ORNAMENT

Materials Needed:

Sauce Pan

Gelatin

Birdseed

Cookie Sheet

Parchment Paper

Non-Stick Cooking Spray

Straws (to make holes)

Ribbon or Twine



Directions:

1.First, in a small saucepan over medium heat, combine water and gelatin. Mix well until the gelatin is dissolved.

2.Remove from the heat and stir in the birdseed until well incorporated.

3.Line a cookie sheet with parchment paper. (Pick out a few fun cookie cutters) Spray the cookie cutters with cooking spray and set them on the pan.

4. Fill the birdseed mixture into each cookie cutter. Make sure to pat down as you go and continue to fill until you reach the top of the cookie cutter. Kids LOVE this part.

5. Next, insert the straw to make the hole for the ribbon or twine hanger.

6. Refrigerate for about an hour or until gelatin is set.

7. Remove the cookie cutters and straws and add ribbon or twine.

Hang outside and let the birds enjoy! This is a great way for the kiddos to watch nature.
